



Regulations

1. Competition Type:

Georgian Championship, Enduro Discipline Kids/Youth

Stage I

Promoter: Enduro Club Georgia / Husky Group

Location: Husky Moto Park

Date: 27.04.2025

1.1 The competition will be held on a non-public road specifically prepared for the event. The competition course includes a terrain of approximately 500 meters of easy difficulty, featuring both artificial and natural obstacles. These are designed to test both the reliability of the motorcycles and the skills of the riders.

Any unforeseen difficulty is considered part of the race, and complaints based on such issues will not be accepted.

The course must be passable under any weather conditions and suitable for children in the respective category.

2. Enduro Kids Discipline Classes

2.1 Motorcycles 65cc–125cc

youth aged 9–14

Eligibility: Only athletes born between October 2010 and October 2016 are allowed to participate. On the date of each of the three stages, participants must be at least 9 years old and not older than 14.

Motorcycles up to 50cc

Kids aged 5–8

Eligibility: Only athletes born between October 2017 and October 2020 may participate. On the date of each of the three stages, participants must be at least 5 years old and not older than 8.

2.2 Participants will be scored based on a point system. The total accumulated points throughout the year will determine the 2025 Champion. If there are different classes, the point evaluation will be done separately for each class.

3. Competition Rules

3.1 The competition consists of three 10-minute runs. All participants start together, and starting positions are determined based on registration. Riders must race for 10 minutes per run; the winner is the one with the highest number of laps completed. Each participant will receive points that also determine starting positions for the next run. Each completed run also grants +1 bonus point. Winners of each category are determined based on the total score from all three runs.

Note: In case of equal laps, the rider who crossed the finish line first takes precedence. In case of tied total points, the rider with the best individual run positions will be favored.

4. Penalties / Disqualification

4.1 Late arrival to the start will result in disqualification from that specific run. Equipment checks will also be performed at the start.

Note: Riders must always have their helmet strap fastened. A loose strap will result in immediate disqualification without explanation.

4.2 Riders must comply with officials:

-) **Yellow flag raised:** Warning – jumping over ramps and overtaking is forbidden. Max speed: 15 km/h.
-) **Red flag raised:** Extreme situation – rider must stop and wait for further instructions. Rule violations lead to disqualification.



4.3 Riders must follow the pre-marked track. Deliberate shortcutting or leaving the course will result in disqualification. If unintentional departure occurs, the rider must re-enter at the same point they left.

4.4 Strictly forbidden to ride motorcycles outside of designated track areas. Violators will be disqualified.

4.5 Riders may file written complaints within 30 minutes after the race. These will be reviewed before the awards ceremony by the officials and race director.

4.6 Participation under the influence of alcohol or substances is prohibited. Leads to disqualification from the stage.

4.7 Neither participants nor team representatives (parents/guardians included) may touch or tamper with another's motorcycle without permission. Leads to disqualification.

4.8 Unsportsmanlike conduct, including foul language, littering, deliberate obstruction or damage to others, unauthorized entry onto the track, arguing with officials, and rule violations will result in disqualification from the championship.

5. Motorcycle Classification

5.1 All types of Enduro and Cross motorcycles may participate, engine capacity 65cc–125cc.

6. Safety

6.1 Mandatory gear for participation includes:

-) Moto boots – required
-) Goggles – required
-) Helmet – required
-) Gloves – required
-) Chest protector – required
-) Knee pads – required
-) Elbow pads – required



6.2 Each participant is aware of race risks and is responsible for their own safety, as well as that of others and spectators.

6.3 Spectators must stay within their designated area and not endanger themselves or others.

6.4 Violations of the above relieve organizers of any civil or criminal liability.

7. Promoter / Organizer Responsibilities

7.1 Properly plan the competition, including coordination during preparation and execution.

7.2 Inform participants in advance about general information and risks.

7.3 Provide an adequate number of officials and ensure objective judging.

7.4 Allocate space for spectators in advance.

7.5 Publish results no later than 2 days after the event.

8. Participant Responsibilities

8.1 Register per organizer instructions. Provide documentation:

-) Adults: ID and national competition license from the Georgian Motorcycle Federation.
-) Minors: Registration must be done by a parent/guardian with birth certificate copy, parent/guardian ID, and license from the federation.

8.2 Attend mandatory briefing organized by the promoter. Attendance is confirmed by signature.

Minors must attend with a parent/guardian, confirmed by their signature.

Absence results in disqualification.

8.3 Arrive at the start zone 1 hour before the race, park the motorcycle in the designated area, and register with the park official.

8.4 Follow officials' instructions without question. Failure results in disqualification.

9. Licensing / Registration



9.1 All participants must have a one-time or annual license from the Georgian Motorcycle Federation for each stage. One-time licenses are obtained during registration before each stage; annual licenses cover all three stages. Licenses available at: www.motofederation.ge

9.2 Registration is free and must be done on the official website: www.motofederation.ge

9.3 Registration opens at a time determined by organizers. Timely registration is mandatory to receive a race number. Required documents: see point 8.1.

10. Recommendations

10.1 In addition to required gear, additional protection is recommended.

10.2 Due to the physical demands of the course, participants are advised to assess their health and act accordingly.

10.3 Riders should ensure their motorcycles are properly prepared and technically sound.
