OFFICIAL REGULATIONS

Event Type: Georgian Championship – Enduro Discipline

Stage: I

Event Name: Boban Rodeo

Location: Husky Moto Park

1. General Information

1.1 The competition will take place on a closed, off-road circuit designed specifically for this event. The course spans approximately 2 km of moderate difficulty terrain, featuring both natural and artificial obstacles. The course aims to test both the reliability of motorcycles and the endurance of riders.

1.2 Any unforeseen difficulties encountered during the competition shall be considered part of the course and will not be grounds for appeal.

1.3 The course must remain passable under all weather conditions and be suitable for riders in the Expert, Moderate, and Hobby classes.

2. Competition Classes

2.1 The Enduro discipline will include the following classes:

-) **Expert Class**
-) **Moderate Class**
-) **Hobby Class**



2.2 Participants will be scored based on a points system. Accumulated points throughout the year will determine the 2025 season champion in each class.

2.3 Riders who place **1st** in the **Hobby** or **Moderate** class during the current year will not be permitted to compete in the same class the following season. Instead:

-) Hobby winners must compete in the Moderate class the next year.
-) Moderate winners must advance to the Expert class.

3. Race Format and Rules

3.1 The race consists of **three 20-minute (+1 lap) heats**. Riders from all classes will start together, and grid positions will be determined by registration order.

-) The winner of each heat is the rider with the most laps completed within the 20-minute time frame.



-)] All participants receive points per heat, which also determines the starting position for the next heat.
-)] Each completed heat earns an additional +1 point.
-)] There is a **30-minute interval** between heats.
-)] Final classification is based on total points accumulated across all three heats.

Note: In case of a tie in laps, the rider who crosses the finish line first will be ranked higher. In the event of a tie in total points, preference is given to the rider with the highest position in any of the heats.

4. Penalties & Disqualification

4.1 Riders arriving late to the start will not be allowed to participate in that heat. Equipment checks will be conducted at the start.

Note: Riders must have their helmet straps fastened at all times during the race. Failure to do so will result in immediate disqualification.

4.2 Riders must comply with officials' instructions at all times:

-)] **Yellow Flag:** Caution – no overtaking or jumping. Max speed: 30 km/h.
-)] **Red Flag:** Emergency – riders must stop immediately and await instructions.

Failure to comply will result in disqualification.

4.3 False Starts:

-)] First offense: warning and restart.
-)] Second offense: heat loss.

4.4 Riders must follow the marked course. Intentional deviation or shortcutting results in disqualification. In case of accidental off-track excursions, riders must return to the course at the exit point.



4.5 Riders may assist each other. External assistance is prohibited and will result in a 2-point penalty for the receiving rider.

4.6 **Strictly Prohibited:** Riding outside the designated race/moto park area. Violators will be disqualified.

4.7 Protests must be submitted in writing within **30 minutes** of race completion. All protests will be reviewed by the Race Director and the Jury prior to the awards ceremony.

4.8 **Grounds for disqualification include:**

-) Participation while under the influence
-) Tampering with another's motorcycle without permission
-) Unsportsmanlike conduct (use of offensive language, littering, intentional obstruction, defiance of officials, etc.)
-) Repeated rule violations

5. Motorcycle Classification

5.1 All Enduro and Motocross motorcycles are allowed. There is no engine displacement limit. No further class distinctions will be made based on motorcycle type.



6. Safety Regulations

6.1 Mandatory rider gear includes:

-) Helmet
-) Goggles
-) Gloves
-) Chest protector
-) Knee pads
-) Elbow pads
-) Moto boots

6.2 Riders accept all associated risks and are responsible for their own and others' safety, including spectators.

6.3 Spectators must remain in designated areas and act responsibly.

6.4 Violation of safety rules relieves the Promoter/Organizer from any legal liability.

7. Promoter/Organizer Responsibilities

7.1 Plan and coordinate the event, considering environmental factors.

7.2 Provide participants with advance safety and event information.

7.3 Appoint a sufficient number of qualified officials.

7.4 Designate spectator areas.

7.5 Publish official results within **two days** after the event.



8. Participant Responsibilities

8.1 Participants must register according to the Promoter's instructions. Required documents:

-) **Adults:** ID + valid National License (issued by the Georgian Motorcycle Federation)
-) **Minors:** Registration must be completed by a parent/legal guardian. Required: birth certificate, guardian's ID copy, and minor's national license.

8.2 Participants must attend the mandatory pre-race briefing. Attendance will be confirmed by signature. Minors must be accompanied by a guardian, whose signature will also be required.

8.3 Riders must report to the paddock **1 hour before** the start. Bikes must be placed in the designated moto park and confirmed by an official.

8.4 Riders must comply unconditionally with officials' instructions.

9. Licensing & Registration

9.1 All participants must possess either a **one-time (50 GEL)** or **annual (200 GEL)** National License issued by the Georgian Motorcycle Federation. Licenses can be obtained at: www.motofederation.ge

9.2 Event registration fee: **150 GEL**. Registration is available online at the Federation's official website.

9.3 Registration will open at a time specified by the Organizer. Riders must register on time to receive a race number.

10. Recommendations

10.1 Additional protective gear beyond the required list is recommended.

10.2 Riders should ensure they are physically fit for the course.

10.3 Motorcycles should be technically inspected and race-ready prior to the event.
