

REGULATIONS

1. Type of Competition

Georgian Cup, disciplines: Cross Country, Enduro

Promoter: N(N)LE Enduro Club Georgia, LLC "Husky Group"

Location:

-) **Day I:** Tbilisi – Bakuriani
 -) **Day II:** Bakuriani – Goderdzi Resort
 -) **Day III:** Goderdzi Resort – Black Sea Coast
- Date:** 19–21 September 2025
Event: CROSS GEORGIA

The race is held on a non-public road specially planned for the competition. The event lasts 3 days. Each competition day includes approximately a 150-180 km route with various natural obstacles such as forest trails, valleys, rocky terrain, ascents, etc. This tests both the reliability of the motorcycle and the endurance of the rider.

Any unforeseen difficulty is considered part of the competition and will not be grounds for a protest.

1.2

Each day's race route includes Bronze, Silver, and Gold finish lines.

1.3

Each race day is limited to 8 hours. At the end of that time, the participant will be credited with the last finish line they crossed.

1.4 Competition Breakdown:

-) **Day I:** Tbilisi – Bakuriani (180 km)
-) **Day II:** Bakuriani – Goderdzi Pass (150 km)
-) **Day III:** Goderdzi Pass – Black Sea Coast (150 km)

1.5 Winners:

Nine winners will be determined based on accuracy and speed across the designated routes. Points are awarded for all riders each day based on finish:

-) Bronze: 1 point
-) Silver: 2 points
-) Gold: 3 points

Based on total points:

-) 3–5 pts: Bronze Finisher
-) 6–8 pts: Silver Finisher
-) 9 pts: Gold Finisher

1.6

At the start of each competition day, participants will be given their personal GPS devices, which will contain only the course designated for that specific day.

1.7

Upon completion of the competition, the participant is obliged to hand over their personal GPS device to an official in order to download/verify the completed course and to upload the new course.

2. Motorcycle Classification

2.1

All types of enduro and motocross motorcycles may participate.

2.2

The motorcycle must comply with Georgian road laws: license plate, turn signals, proper lights.

2.3

Participants must hold a valid driving license.

For minors: Must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at registration/briefing with a birth certificate (or copy) and the ID of the parent/guardian. The guardian accepts full responsibility.

Note: The race route intersects public roads at some points. Participants must follow all traffic laws. For minors, parents/guardians (or their assigned support vehicle) must ensure safe transport on public roads.

-) GPS holder for the motorcycle
-) Mobile phone
-) Spare battery (for GPS/phone)
-) Tool bag
-) Motorcycle boots
-) Helmet
-) Gloves
-) Hydration pack (Camelbak)
-) Goggles
-) Pepper spray
-) Lighter/matches
-) Spare fuel (1.5L) – *recommended*

-) Chest protector – *recommended*
-) Knee and elbow guards – *recommended*
-) Raincoat – *recommended*
-) Rope – *recommended*

Tire recommendation: mousse. If using tubes, carry spares or repair tools.

3.2

Each participant assumes all risks and is responsible for their own and others' safety.

3.3

Spectators must not enter restricted areas or endanger themselves or others.

3.4

Violation of the above waives the organizer's legal liability.

4. Organizer/Promoter Obligations

- 4.1 Proper race planning and coordination.
- 4.2 Inform participants about the race and risks.
- 4.3 Allocate sufficient staff.
- 4.4 Designate viewing areas.
- 4.5 Define start/finish areas and fueling zones.

5. Participant Obligations

5.1 Register per rules and provide:

-) GNMF one-time license
-) ID document
-) Registration form

5.2 Attend mandatory briefing.

Minors must attend with a parent/guardian.

5.3 Provide a support vehicle for:

-) Refueling
-) Mechanical support
-) Food
-) Emergency evacuation

5.4 Arrive at the start line 30 minutes early. Once placed, the motorcycle may not be moved except during the race or with official permission.

5.5 Obey all officials without question.

5.6 Forbidden to participate under the influence.

5.7 Forbidden to touch others' motorcycles.

5.8 Unsportsmanlike conduct is prohibited (e.g., profanity, littering, deliberate obstruction, verbal conflict, rule violations).

5.9 Violations will lead to disqualification.

6. Licensing / Registration

6.1 All participants must obtain a **GTMF one-time license** – cost: 50 GEL
Available during registration at www.motofederation.ge

6.2 Competition Registration fees:

-) Until **30 June**: 450 GEL
-) Until **31 July**: 550 GEL
-) Until **31 August**: 650 GEL
-) From **1–17 September**: 950 GEL

6.3 Registration closes on **17.09.2025 at 22:00**

7. Competition Rules

7.1 Start order based on registration number. Riders start in pairs every 60 seconds.
Late arrivals start upon arrival, but time starts from assigned time.
Delay of 20+ minutes = disqualification for the day.

Full gear and full fuel tank required at start.

Helmet strap must be secured during the race – violation results in disqualification.

7.2 No switching motorcycles or riders.

7.3 Must stay on marked path. Deviations = penalties or disqualification.

7.4 Speed limits on GPS must be followed.

7.5 Outside assistance only allowed at designated zones. Rider-to-rider help is allowed anywhere. A competitor who has completed the competition day is considered an external person and is prohibited from assisting another participant.

7.6 Daily GPS handover is mandatory. Failure = no credit for that day.

7.7 If withdrawing, rider must inform their support crew and officials.

7.8 Appeals must be submitted in writing within 30 minutes of results. The jury will decide within 5 working days.

8. Recommendations

8.1 Additional protective gear encouraged.

8.2 Form teams of 2–4 riders to help each other.

8.3 Assess physical health in advance.

8.4 Ensure your motorcycle is well-prepared and in good technical condition.
