



REGULATIONS

1. Type of Competition:

Georgian Championship, Enduro Discipline (Kids / Youth)

Stage I

Promoter: Enduro Club Georgia

Location: Tbilisi, Husky Moto Park

Date: 26.04.2026

The competition is held on a specially prepared non-public track. The course includes approximately 500 meters of easy terrain with artificial and natural obstacles, aimed at testing both motorcycle reliability and rider skills.

Any unforeseen difficulty is considered part of the competition and cannot be subject to complaint.

The course must be passable in all weather conditions and suitable for children and youth categories.

2. Enduro Discipline – Children / Youth Classes

2.1 Class: EK 50cc

Motorcycle: 2T up to 50cc, 4T up to 100cc

Tyres (maximum size): Front – 12”, Rear – 10”

Age: 5–8 years

Only riders whose age, at any stage of the 2026 Georgian Championship, is at least 5 years and no more than 9 years are eligible to participate (the rider’s date of birth must not be later than 2017).

If a rider turns 9 during the 2026 season, the parent/guardian has the right to choose between the EK 50cc and EY 65cc–85cc classes. In such case, the motorcycle specifications must comply with the requirements of the selected class.



2.2 Class: EY 65cc–85cc

Motorcycle: 2T 65cc–85cc, 4T 100cc–200cc

Tyres (maximum size): Front – 19”, Rear – 17”

Age: 9–13 years

Only riders whose age, at any stage of the 2026 Georgian Championship, is at least 8 years (provided that the rider turns 9 during the 2026 season) and no more than 14 years are eligible to participate (the rider’s date of birth must not be later than 2012).

If a rider turns 14 during the 2026 season, the parent/guardian has the right to choose between the EY 65cc–85cc and EY/1 125cc–150cc classes. The motorcycle must comply with the specifications of the selected class.

2.3 Class: EY/1 85cc–125cc

Motorcycle: 2T 85cc–125cc, 4T up to 250cc

Tyres: No restrictions (front and rear)

Age: 14–17 years

Only riders whose age, at any stage of the 2026 Georgian Championship, is at least 13 years (provided that the rider turns 14 during the 2026 season) and no more than 17 years are eligible to participate (the rider’s date of birth must not be later than 2009).

If a rider turns 18 during the 2026 season, they will no longer be eligible to compete in the Enduro Youth discipline and may instead participate in any class of the Enduro Adult discipline.

Note: Riders aged 15 and above are allowed to compete in the Enduro Adult discipline in any class, provided they have parental/guardian consent.

2.4 Scoring System

Participants will be evaluated using a points system. The total points accumulated throughout the year will determine the 2026 Georgian Champion in each class.

Points are awarded separately for each class. In case a rider changes class during the championship, points accumulated in different classes will not be combined.

A participant has the right to join the Georgian Championship at any stage within the appropriate age category.



2.5 Class Validity

A class shall be considered valid if at least 3 (three) riders are registered in that class.

If fewer than 3 riders are registered, the organizer reserves the right to cancel the class or merge it with another appropriate class. In case of merging, participants will be evaluated according to rules determined by the organizer.

3. Competition Rules

The competition consists of three 10-minute races. All participants start together. Starting positions are based on registration.

The winner is the rider completing the most laps. Final ranking is based on total points from all races.

In case of equal laps, priority is given to the rider who crosses the finish line first.

In case of equal total points, priority is given to the rider with better results during the day.

If equal points remain at season level, priority is given to the rider with better results in the final stage.

4. Penalties / Disqualification

Late arrival at the start results in exclusion from that race.

Helmet must always be fastened while riding. Violation results in immediate disqualification.

Yellow flag: warning, no overtaking or jumping, max speed 30 km/h.

Red flag: stop immediately and wait for instructions.

False start:

- First offense: restart

- Second offense: loss of round

Leaving the marked track leads to disqualification unless returning from the same point.

Participants may assist each other. External assistance results in a 2-point penalty.

Riding outside designated areas leads to disqualification.

Complaints must be submitted within 30 minutes after the race.

Participation under influence is prohibited (disqualification).

Unsportsmanlike behavior leads to championship disqualification.

Failure to return transponder: 300 EUR fine.

5. Motorcycle Classification

All enduro and motocross motorcycles allowed per class specifications.

6. Safety

Mandatory gear:

- Boots
- Helmet
- Goggles
- Gloves
- Chest protector
- Knee guards
- Elbow guards

Participants are responsible for safety.

Spectators must remain in designated areas.



7. Organizer Responsibilities

- Proper planning
- Inform participants
- Provide officials
- Ensure fair judging
- Publish results within 2 days

8. Participant Responsibilities

- Complete registration
- Provide documents
- Attend briefing (mandatory)
- Arrive 1 hour before event start
- Follow instructions

9. Licensing and Registration

License required for all participants:

- One-time or annual license via www.motofederation.ge

Registration is free.

10. Recommendations

- Additional protective gear recommended
- Ensure physical readiness
- Ensure motorcycle condition
