



CROSS GEORGIA Adventure 2026

Supplementary Regulations

1. Event Description

1.1 Event Name

Cross Georgia Adventure is a 3-day adventure competition held on specially designed off-road routes as well as public roads.

The competition includes forest trails, climbs, descents, technical obstacles, and other sections of moderate terrain, designed to test the rider's endurance, technical skills, navigation ability, and the reliability of the motorcycle.

1.2 Event Date

The competition will take place on:

06–08 August 2026

1.3 Event Location

The start, finish, and administrative control locations of the event will be announced at a later stage and published through the Organizer/Promoter's official communication channels.

2. Competition Format

2.1 Competition Days

The event consists of **three (3) independent competition days**.

Each day includes an individual GPS track, technical sections, and the corresponding finish system.

2.2 Time Limit

The maximum duration of each competition day is:

8 hours



The Organizer reserves the right to modify the time limit due to safety reasons, weather conditions, or force majeure circumstances.

2.3 Finish System

Each competition day is divided into the following finish categories:

- Bronze Finish
- Silver Finish
- Gold Finish

The finish category shall take priority over points.

3. Registration and Licensing

3.1 Event Registration

Registration shall be completed via:

www.motofederation.ge

3.2 Entry Fee / Registration Fee

The combined event registration and single-event licence fee is as follows:

- **350 GEL** – until 10 July
(Event registration + single-event licence)
- **550 GEL** – until 31 July
(Event registration + single-event licence)
- **850 GEL** – 01–04 August
(Event registration + single-event licence)

3.3 Registration Deadline

Registration closes on:

04 August 2026 – 18:00



Registration shall be considered valid only upon:

- full completion of the registration form;
- completion of licence registration;
- payment of the required fee.

3.4 Refund Policy (Registration & Licence Fees)

Refunds shall be issued only in the event that the competition is cancelled by the Organizer.

In such case, the refundable amount shall be calculated as follows: from the total collected entry fees, all verified organizational expenses already incurred shall be deducted, and the remaining balance shall be distributed equally among registered participants.

In all other cases, including withdrawal from the event, refusal to participate, or failure to attend, the entry fee shall not be refundable.

4. Administrative and Technical Control

4.1 Administrative Control

The time and location of administrative control will be announced later.

At administrative control, riders must present:

- Identification document;
- Driving licence;
- Proof of event registration.

4.2 Technical Control

Technical control will include:

- visual inspection of the motorcycle;
- verification of safety compliance;
- verification of GPS device compatibility;
- inspection of mandatory equipment.



The Organizer reserves the right to exclude any technically unfit motorcycle from the competition.

5. Riders' Briefing

5.1 Mandatory Briefing

Attendance at the Riders' Briefing is mandatory for all participants.

The exact time and location will be announced later.

The briefing will cover:

- daily route;
- safety matters;
- support zones;
- refuelling zones;
- time restrictions;
- special technical sections;
- other important competition-related information.

Failure to attend the briefing may result in exclusion from the competition.

6. Starting Procedure

6.1 First Competition Day

Starting order for the first day shall be determined by registration order.

6.2 Second and Third Days

Starting order for the second and third days shall be determined by the previous day's results.

6.3 Start Interval

Riders shall start individually at:



30-second intervals

6.4 Late Arrival

A rider who fails to appear at the assigned start time shall start immediately upon arrival; however, the official timing shall begin from the rider's assigned start time.

7. GPS, Support Zones and Fuel Points

7.1 GPS Track

Before the start of each competition day, riders will receive the corresponding GPS track.

7.2 Support Zones / Refuel Zones

Locations of Support Zones and refuelling points shall be defined in advance and communicated to riders via:

- GPS device
- official information channels

7.3 Prohibited Assistance

External assistance is prohibited on competition sections, except in zones designated by the Organizer.

8. Mandatory and Recommended Equipment

8.1 Mandatory Equipment

Each rider must be equipped with:

- GPS device;
- GPS mounting system on motorcycle;
- mobile phone;
- backup battery or power bank;
- motorcycle tool kit;



- motocross/enduro boots;
- helmet;
- gloves;
- hydration system (CamelBak);
- goggles;
- lighter or matches.

8.2 Recommended Equipment

Participants are recommended to additionally carry:

- chest protector;
- knee protection;
- elbow protection;
- waterproof gear;
- rope;
- spare inner tube or tyre repair kit;
- reserve fuel.

9. Official Communications

Any changes, additional information, locations, schedules, or safety instructions related to the competition shall be published through the Organizer's official communication channels and shall be considered officially valid upon publication.



10. Final Provisions

By registering for **Cross Georgia Adventure 2026**, the participant confirms that:

- they have read and understood the general regulations and supplementary regulations of Cross Georgia;
- they are aware of the risks associated with the competition;
- they accept full personal responsibility;
- they agree to comply with the decisions of the Organizer and the Jury.
